#### A BRIEF HISTORY OF FIRST STREET SPEAKERS by Alyson King

Our club was chartered in January of 2006 by Srinivas R. Achanta, CTM who became a Toastmaster in 2001. Srinivas started his Toastmasters adventure in the Steinbeck Toastmasters club in Salinas. There he entered speech competitions early on, using the added pressure of speaking before a large group of strangers to enhance his skill set. Srinivas was (and still is) an IT employee at Actel Corporation, a producer of FPGA semiconductors then located in Mountain View. After several years in his home club he realized he wanted to bring the benefits of Toastmasters to Actel. Director of Actel Human Resources, Carl Cheney, agreed with him and together they launched Actel Flashmasters.

The club chartered with 25 members and I joined the club the second term of that year. So while I am not a charter member, I am the oldest remaining member of the club. The club started strong with solid members and capable officers but has seen it's share of changes in it's 13 year journey. Before 2010, Actel relocated the campus to the current First Street location. Microsemi Corporation then acquired Actel in 2010 which not only catalyzed a club name change, and we became Microsemi Masters, but also affected our club



size and strength. The acquisition hit our club roster hard due to subsequent downsizing, resulting in more than a year of low or no attendance meetings. The District stepped in to offer support and sent us Stan Ng, our club coach. Stan helped breathe new life into the club. He became a member, attending our weekly meetings where he encouraged membership-building activities and Toastmaster best practices. We became an open club, accepting members outside the company, to bolster our ranks and this made a big difference. Now we needed a new name to reflect our noncorporate identity. In the club-naming contest, Debbie Chuang came up with the winning name and we became First Street Speakers.

I've served several officer roles over the years, but I have to say I've never been so proud or excited as I have been this year with our current slate of officers. They just keep adding value with all their contributions. Our educational goal achievements are exemplary and our social media presence has really taken off. Guests keep giving us feedback that we are uniquely organized and fun. There is a new level of energy and enthusiasm in the meetings driving us toward neverseen-before levels of accomplishment! I am honored to be a First Street Speaker today as we continue to make club history.
